Ambulance Service

The Town of Winfield has been a part of the Reedsburg Area Ambulance Commission since its inception in 2010. The commission included 10 towns, 3 villages, and the City of Reedsburg. Effective 12/31/23, this commission will be dissolved and the ambulance service will be controlled by the City of Reedsburg. The town signed a contract to have the City of Reedsburg provide all ambulance services to town residents.

Stop Lines

Have you noticed most town roads now have a large white line at the intersection with another road? The county installed these stop lines. According to state statute, if there is a clearly marked stop line, the operator shall stop the vehicle immediately before crossing such line.

Comprehensive Plan

In 2005, the Town of Winfield began their work on developing a comprehensive plan. The purpose of the plan is to promote informed land use decisions. This includes the town guiding future growth, development, and preservation.

The plan:

- identifies those areas appropriate for development and preservation
- 2. preserves wildlife habitat
- 3. preserves wooded hillsides, farmsteads, fields, and prairies
- 4. maintains the overall rural community atmosphere
- 5. encourages a balance between proposed development and resource protection

Most items reviewed by the Plan Commission include certified survey maps and driveway permits. Other items include subdivision plans, conditional use permits, planned community development, building accessory structures, and annexations.

State statutes require the plan to be reviewed annually. The Plan Commission and Town Board have been doing an extensive review of the plan over the last few months. The goal is to have a public hearing on the updated plan in the first part of 2024.

Recycling & Garbage Update

We contract with Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) for our garbage and recycling pick up for household waste. They do not pick up furniture-type items.

Polling Place & Poll Hours - The polling place is the Winfield Town Hall at the intersection of County Roads K and F just north of Reedsburg (S1992 County Road K). The polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Mental Health issues can affect anyone.

Mental health includes our emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It affects how we think, feel, and act. And, it helps determine how we manage stress, relate to others, and make choices.

An estimated 1 in 5 (21.8%) of Sauk County adults have depression. *

Everyone feels down occasionally, but if your sadness continues for more than 2 weeks with some of the symptoms listed below, it could be depression.

- Feelings of guilt or worthlessness
- Lack of interest or energy for everyday activities
- Loss of interest or pleasure for activities that used to be enjoyable
- Changes in weight or appetite
- Changes in sleep habits or energy level
- Difficulty concentrating
- Suicidal thoughts
